## A Very Fast Christmas Card



## Supplies

- Christmas Classics Photopolymer Stamp Set
- Brightest Glow Stamp Set*
- Very Vanilla Note Cards \& Envelopes
- Traditions of St. Nick Designer Series Paper
- Very Vanilla card stock, scrap size
- Real Red Stampin Ink pad
- Real Red \& Garden Green Ribbon
- Glue Dots
- Multi Purpose Liquid Glue


## Directions

- Stamp your inside greeting first before folding the card; it is a little easier to do it this way. The inside greeting I used is from the Brightest Glow Stamp Set; of course an inside greeting is completely optional*.
- Stamp your outside greeting onto a square of vanilla card stock cut to $5.5 \mathrm{~cm} \times 5.5 \mathrm{~cm}(2-1 / 8 \times 2-1 / 8)$. If you have the matching dies set to the Christmas Classics Stamp Set, you can die cut the squares using the square die.
- Cut your patterned papers to $8.5 \mathrm{~cm} \times 12 \mathrm{~cm}(3-1 / 4$ " $\times 4-3 / 4$ "). Glue to the front of your card.
- I used Stampin Dimensionals to raise up the greeting, which is centered on the card. If you are making a lot of cards and need to keep the costs down, glue the greeting directly onto the patterned paper layer.


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- Tie a bow with matching ribbon and use a glue dot to affix to the greeting.
- I made three each of the cards shown below, except for the red on the end, I made six of that one. I had fun mixing them up a bit. (My husband likes to give Christmas cards to his team.)

I have listed the ink colors and ribbons I used in the photo right, they all match the Traditions of St. Nick Designer Series Paper:

- Real Red Stampin Pad
- Garden Green Stampin Pad
- Real Red \& Garden Green 3/8" ribbon
- Pebble Path Stampin Pad
- Pebble Path 3/8" Textured Ribbon
- Copper Clay Stampin Pad
- Copper Clay 3/8" Textured Ribbon
- Old Olive Stampin Pad
- Wild Wheat 3/8" Textured Ribbon
- Cherry Cobbler Stampin Pad
