

Another Quick Christmas Card



Supplies

- Half sheet of Wheat card stock
 - Quarter sheet of White card stock for card liner
 - plus a scrap of white card stock
 - Traditions of St. Nick Designer Series paper
 - Brightest Glow Stamp Set
 - Heartfelt Hexagon Photopolymer Stamp Set (Optional)
 - Hexagon Punch
 - Wild Wheat Textured Ribbon
 - Stampin Dimensionals
- Card base is cut to 10.5cm x 29.7cm (4-1/4" x 11"), scored at 14.85 (5-1/2") and folded in half.
 - First layer of patterned paper is cut to 10cm x 14.3cm (4" x 5-1/4"). Glue this layer to the card front leaving a border of approximately .5cm (1/4") showing. If you are using a piece of white card stock for a card liner cut it to the same size and glue to the inside of the card.
 - Cut a strip of patterned paper to 2cm x 12.cm (3/4"x 4-1/4:"), and another one to 2.3cm x 9cm (7/8" x 3-1/4"). Glue down as shown in the photo.
 - I am going to admit something here. The red & green pieces of paper were scraps left over from other cards so the measurements were what

- they were. Saying this, get out your scraps and see if you have something similar and just use them instead of cutting up more paper. You can also use scraps of colored card stock instead of the patterned paper.
- Using the scrap of white cardstock stamp your greeting with Wild Wheat ink. Here I used one from the Brightest Glow Stamp set and a border stamp from the Heartfelt Hexagon Photopolymer set. The greeting is cut out using the Hexagon Punch.
- I have both of these sets but if you only have a greeting set you can easily cut a rectangle or even a circle from white and stamp your greeting. I liked the look of stitching around the outside of the greeting you can do that easily by hand with a marker making small dots/dashes around the edge.
- Cut ribbon to approximately 23.5cm (9-1/4") and loop behind the greeting. Raise greeting up on dimensionals to add more interest and depth.
