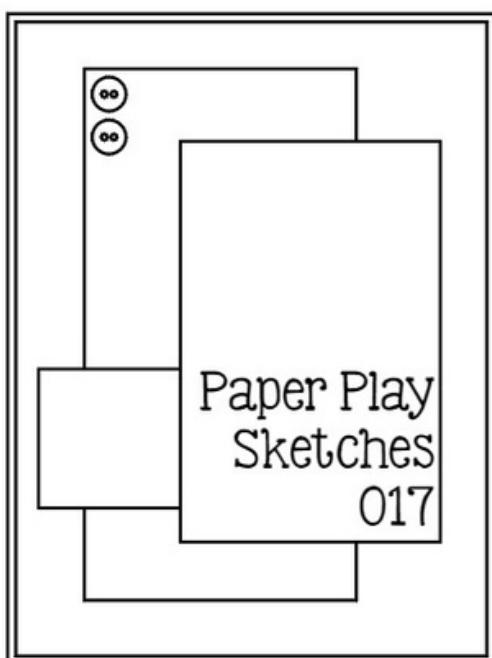

Take to the Sky May Card Sketch

Supplies

- Adventurous Sky
- Mossy Meadow Card Stock
- Smoky Slate Card Stock
- Basic White Card Stock
- Take to the Sky Designer Series Paper
- Smoky Slate Stampin Pad
- Basic Grey Stampin Pad
- Baker's Twine Essentials
- Industrial Trinkets
- Blending Brushes
- Paper Trimmer
- Multipurpose Liquid Glue
- Stampin Dimensionals

Directions

- Cut a side opening card base 21cm x 14.85 (8-1/2" x 5-1/2") from the Mossy Meadow card stock. Score halfway at 10.5cm (4-1/4").
- The first layer cut from Smoky Slate card stock and is 10cm x 14.4cm (4" x 5-1/4"). This piece is glued down to the card front leaving an equal border all the way around. Using a blending brush smudge the edges of the card with Smoky Slate Ink before gluing down to the card base.
- Optional: Cut a card liner out of basic white, 10cm x 14.4cm (4" x 5-1/4"). You could also use the Smoky Slate card stock as it is light enough for hand writing to show up nicely.
- The larger rectangle is cut from the Take to the Sky Designer Series 15.2 cm x 15.2cm (6" x 6") Paper. This layer was also smudged along the edges with the Smoky Slate ink.
- The next size rectangle is cut from another piece of the Take to the Sky Designer Paper. The dimensions used are: 5cm x 11.5cm (2" x 4-1/8"). Again smudge the edges of the paper with the Smoky Slate ink.
- The airplane is stamped onto this small rectangle of Smoky Slate card stock, using the Basic Grey Stampin Pad. It is cut to 3.5cm x 5cm (1-3/8" x 2"), don't forget to also brush some of the Smoky Slate around the edges.
- I looped a piece of grey bakers twine behind the greeting and popped it up on dimensionals.
- The card is finished with a pair of Industrial Trinkets.
