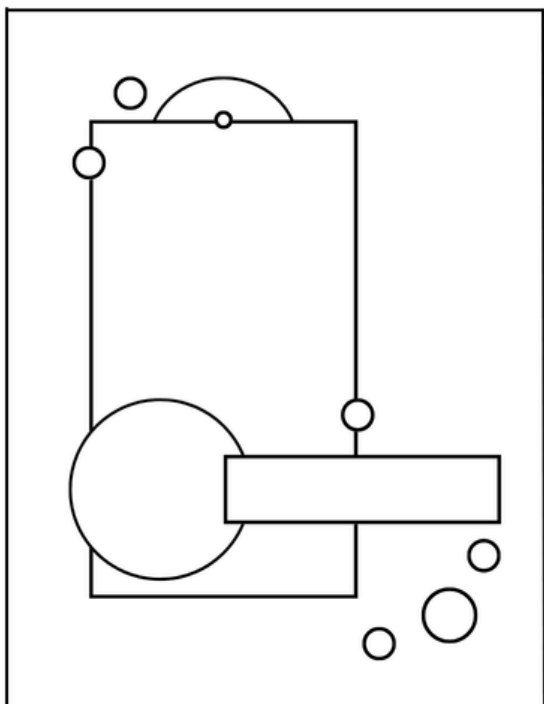

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News Flash June Card Sketch



Supplies

- Bright Borders Photopolymer Stamp Set
- Notes & Totes Photopolymer Stamp Set
- To the Point Label Punch
- Plaster Painting 3-D Embossing Folder
- Mixed Media Florals Designer Series Paper
- Petal Pink Card Stock
- Poppy Parade Card Stock
- Basic White Card Stock (optional)
- Memento Tuxedo Black Stampin Pad
- Low Profile Dots
- Multipurpose Liquid Glue
- Stampin Dimensionals
- Paper Trimmer
- Mini Cut and Emboss Machine

Directions

- Cut a right side opening card base 21cm x 14.85 (8-1/2" x 5-1/2") from the Petal Pink card stock. Score at 10.5cm (4-1/4"). Fold and burnish well.
- Optionally cut a card liner from basic white card stock measuring 10cm x 14.35cm (4" x 4-1/2").
- For the First Layer cut a piece of the Poppy Parade card stock to 10.5cm x 14.85 cm (4-1/4" x 5-1/2"). Emboss this piece using the Plaster Painting 3-D embossing folder. Using the paper trimmer, trim this piece to 10cm x 14.35cm (4" x 4-1/2"). Adhere to the front of the card base leaving a narrow equal border all the way around.
- For the next layer cut a rectangle from a piece of the Mixed Media Florals Designer Series paper to 5.1cm x 8.3cm (2" x 3-1/4"). Insert the top edge (5.1cm or 2") into the To the Point Punch and cut shaping the top edge only.
- Punch out two of the To the Point shapes out of the Petal Pink card stock. Stamp each piece with one of the border dies from the Bright Borders stamp set using the Tuxedo Black Memento ink.
- Using the liquid glue, adhere one of the stamped, pink Point shapes to the underside of the rectangle. There should be *about* 1.5cm (3/8") of the pink showing above the cut end. See finished photo for reference.
- Adhere the second pink Point shape to the front of the rectangle strip. I placed this piece so that if both pink pieces were placed on the front, the tips would just touch each other. This is a design decision and I encourage you to look at the spaces involved and place where you think appropriate. Trim the back side of the rectangle away so that it does not show below the pink Point piece.
- Place the shaped rectangle piece you just created on to the card front as shown in the finished photo. Raising it up on dimensionals.
- Cut a strip of Poppy Parade card stock 6.3cm x 2.5cm (2-1/2" x 1"). Cut a strip of Petal Pink card stock to 5.8cm x 2cm (2-1/4" x 3/4"). Stamp the greeting using tuxedo ink (the one I used is from the Notes & Totes Photopolymer Stamp Set). Place a dimensional onto the right side of the back of the greeting strip and place down as shown on the card. I used a bit of liquid glue to adhere the left side of the greeting to the pink Point piece.
- Finish the card using the pink dots from the Low Profile Dots embellishment set.
