


Supplies

- Christmas Greenery Stamp Set
- Christmas Greenery Dies
- Traditional Wreath Embossing Folder
- Traditions of Christmas
 Designer Series Paper
- Old Olive Card Stock
- Basic white Card Stock
- VersaMark Ink (clear)
- Stampin Blend Markers

- Metallics WOW Embossing Powder in Gold
- Traditional Sparkling Sequins
- Multipurpose Liquid Glue
- Stampin Dimensionals
- Paper Trimmer
- Heat Tool
- Embossing Additions Tool
- Cut and Emboss Machine

Directions

- Cut a right side opening card base 21cm x 14.85 (8-1/2" x 5-1/2") from the Old Olive card stock. Score at 10.5cm (4-1/4"). Fold and burnish well. If you prefer something a little different this card would work well with a bottom opening card. In which case your half sheet of card stock would measure 10.5cm x 29.7cm (4-1/4" x 11"). Score half way on the long side at 14.84cm (5-1/2")
- Optionally, but recommended, cut a card liner from basic white card stock measuring 10cm x 14.35cm (4" x 5-1/4").
- For the First Layer cut a piece of the Traditions of Christmas Designer Series Paper to 10cm x 14.35cm (4" x 5-1/4"). Adhere to card front being sure you create an *equal* border of about .25cm (1/4") of the Old Olive on all sides. (See finished photo.)
- For the next layer I used a strip of the Old Olive card stock cut to 10cm x 1.5cm (4" x 3/4"). Place the strip into the Traditional Wreath 3-D Embossing Folder. Position it so that you get the densest embossing possible on the strip, and run the folder through your embossing machine. Glue this strip to the upper third of the card front. You can refer to the position in the finished photo.
- The focal point is stamped onto apiece of white card stock using VersaMark ink. Sprinkle the image with the Gold Metallic Embossing powder and emboss with a heat tool.
- To color the image I used Stampin Blend markers in the following colors:
- Poinsettia, -Real Red, light & dark, Cherry Cobbler, light
- Secondary Flowers Bubble Bath, light & dark
- Leaves -Pool Party, light & dark
- Pine sprigs -Old Olive, light & dark
- Die cut the image using the coordinating die from the Christmas Greenery die set. Place dimensionals on the back of the image and place on the card front, again referring to the finished photo.
- Finish up the card by adding some of the Traditional Sparkling Sequins.
