

Coloring on your Designer Series Papers October Card Sketch No. 2

Supplies

- Delightful Motifs Stamp Set
- Delightful Motifs Dies
- Stylish Shapes Dies
- Beautiful Gallery Designer
 Series Paper
- Basic Beige Card Stock
- Garden Green Card Stock
- Basic Grey Stampin Pad
- Antique Pearls

- Watercolor Pencil Set, Asst. 1 & 2
- Stampin Blend Color Lifter
- Multipurpose Liquid Glue
- Stampin Dimensionals
- Paper Trimmer
- Cut and Emboss Machine

Directions

- Cut a right side opening card base 21cm x 14.85 (8-1/2" x 5-1/2") from the Basic Beige card stock. Score at 10.5cm (4-1/4"). Fold and burnish well.
- Optionally, but recommended, cut a card liner from basic beige card stock measuring 10cm x 14.35cm (4" x 5-1/4"). Eventhough you can easily write on the basic beige I still use liner to increase the weight of the card and to make an opportunity to stamp on the inside.
- For the First Layer cut a piece of the Beautiful Gallery Florals Designer Series Paper to 10cm x 14.35cm (4" x 5-1/4"). For this exercise I choose a piece of the beige & grey peony paper. Color in the flowers and leaves using the watercolor pencils. I used the following colors: for the flowers-Flirty Flamingo & Real Red, for the leaves-Garden Green & Old olive. When all of the elements are colored go over them lightly with the Color Lifter to blend the colors together. (See close up photo at the bottom)
- Glue the first layer piece flat to the card front leaving an equal border of the card base showing all the way around.
- Die cut the fern element from a scrap of Garden Green Card Stock.
- Using the small medium flag shaped die from Stylish Shapes dies cut out a basic beige label. Stamp the greeting in Basic Grey.
- Adhere the label to the die cut as shown in the finished photo. Place dimensionals on the back side of these two pieces treating them as one object and glue to the card front.
- Finish the card with some of the Antique Pearls embellishments.
