

## Merry and Bright December Card Sketch





## **Supplies**

- Christmas Greenery Stamp Set
- Christmas Greenery Dies
- Traditional Labels Stamp Set
- Traditional Labels Dies
- Traditions of Christmas
   Designer Series Paper
- Real Red Card Stock
- Basic White Card Stock

- Secret Sea Stampin Pad
- Old Olive Stampin Pad
- Real Red Stampin Pad
- Traditional Sparkling Sequins
- Multipurpose Liquid Glue
- Stampin Dimensionals
- Paper Trimmer
- Cut and Emboss Machine

## **Directions**

- Cut a right side opening card base 21cm x 14.85 (8-1/2" x 5-1/2") from the Real Red card stock. Score at 10.5cm (4-1/4"). Fold and burnish well.
- Optionally, but recommended, cut a card liner from basic white card stock measuring 10cm x 14.35cm (4" x 5-1/4").
- For the First Layer cut a piece of the Traditions of Christmas Designer Series Paper to 10cm x 14.35cm (4" x 5-1/4"). Adhere this piece to the card base leaving an equal border of card stock on on all sides.
- The second layer is a pair of rectangles, 4.5cm x 10cm (1-3/4" x 3-7/8") each cut from a third and fourth piece of the Traditions of Christmas DSP. Glue to the card front as shown in the card sketch/finished photo.
- The greeting is die cut from a scrap of basic white card stock using one
  of the larger Traditional Label dies. The words are stamped in Secret
  Sea ink, the pine pieces are stamped in Old Olive ink and the berries
  are stamped with Real Red ink. The words are from the Traditional
  Labels stamp set, the floral elements come from the Christmas
  Greenery stamp set.
- Die cut the bow pieces from the Traditions of Christmas Designer Series Paper. In this example I choose one of the same pieces as I used for the rectangles. Glue the die cut pieces together to form the bow and adhere to the bottom of the greeting.
- Adhere the greeting to the card front using dimensionals.
- Finish the card by placing a few of the Traditional Sparkling Sequins on the card front.
