

Supplies

- Fabulous Sayings Photopolymer Stamp Set
- Stylish Shapes Die Set
- Damask Designs Embossing Folder
- Painted Illusions Designer Series Paper
- Lost Lagoon Card Stock
- Basic White Card Stock
- Lost Lagoon Stampin' Pad
- Iridescent Foil Gems
- Multipurpose Liquid Glue
- Dimensionals
- Scissors
- Paper Trimmer
- Cut and Emboss Machine

Directions

- Cut a right side opening card base 21cm x 14.85 (8-1/2" x 5-1/2") from the Lost Lagoon card stock. Score at 10.5cm (4-1/4"). Fold and burnish well.
- Optionally, but recommended, cut a card liner from Basic White card stock measuring 10cm x 14.35cm (4" x 5-1/4"). Adhere to the inside of the card.
- For the background, cut a rectangle from a piece of the Painted Illusions Designer Series Paper measuring 9.5cm x 13.85cm (3-3/4" x 5"). Adhere to the center of your card front leaving an equal border of card stock showing on all sides.
- Die cut two 7cm (2-3/4") circles from a coordinating piece of Painted Illusions Designer Series Paper. I used circles from the Stylish Shapes dies set but you could use a punch or fussy cut circles.
- Next cut a small rectangle of Lost Lagoon card stock, measuring 8cm x 4.5cm (3-1/8" x 1-3/4"). Emboss this piece using the Damask Designs embossing folder.
- For the greeting cut a scrap of Basic White card stock to 9.5cm x 2cm (3-3/4 x 7/8") Stamp the greeting in Lost Lagoon ink. The greeting I used is from the Fabulous Sayings photopolymer stamp set.
- Layer the white greeting piece over the embossed Lost Lagoon piece. Add dimensionals to the back side of the unit and adhere to the center of the card.
- Finish with a trio of Iridescent Foil Gems.
