

Supplies

- Paradise Garden Photopolymer Stamp Set
- Paradise Garden Dies
- Paradise Garden 3-D Embossing Folder
- Garden Poetry Designer Series Paper
- Basic White Card Stock
- Berry Burst Stampin' Pad
- Blackberry Bliss Stampin' Pad
- Garden Epoxy Dots
- Multipurpose Liquid Glue
- Stampin' Dimensionals
- Stampin' Brayer
- Paper Trimmer
- Cut and Emboss Machine

Directions

- Cut a right side opening card base 21cm x 14.85 (8-1/2" x 5-1/2") from Basic White card stock. Score at 10.5cm (4-1/4"). Fold and burnish well.
- For the background, cut out two strips of one pattern from the Garden Poetry Designer Series Paper set, 1.5cm x 15cm (5/8" x 5-3/4").
- Glue one of the strips to the left card front along the fold of the card. Glue the other strip to the right side with the card with the strip fold aligned with the right edge of the card front. I intentionally cut the strips a little long. Trim to fit the card length after your adhesive has dried.
- Stamp two different leaf shapes onto a scrap white card stock using Berry Burst ink. Die cut the leaf shapes and set aside for the moment.
- For the first layer (beneath the greeting) cut a rectangle out of white card stock measuring 5 cm x 10cm (2" x 4")**. Using a brayer and Blackberry Bliss ink, ink up one side of your embossing folder. You want to put ink on the side that has the leaf indents. Most of the ink will only go on the raised ridge around the leaves. I had some go onto the 'background' but it still looked good. Place your card stock into the folder and run through your Cut & Emboss machine. Just run the brayer and folder under clean water to while the ink is still wet to speed clean up.
- Please note ** this is the finished size of the background piece. I used a larger piece of card stock so I could have a choice of the finished pattern. Embossing with ink can get quite messy so having the option to trim off any mistakes or ink smear finger prints is helpful. I used a ¼ sheet of card stock to fit the embossing folder.
- Adhere in place using the finished photo and card sketch to help with the position.
- Using a scrap of Basic White card stock, die cut the banner shape from the Paradise Garden die set. Stamp the 'thank you' greeting from the Paradise Garden stamp set with Berry Burst ink.
- Adhere one of your leaf die cuts to the right edge of the back of the greeting piece and the other leaf shape to the bottom left edge. Place dimensionals on the back of the greeting piece. Adhere the greeting unit to the card front using the photo and sketch for placement.
- Finish with a trio of Garden Epoxy Dots.
