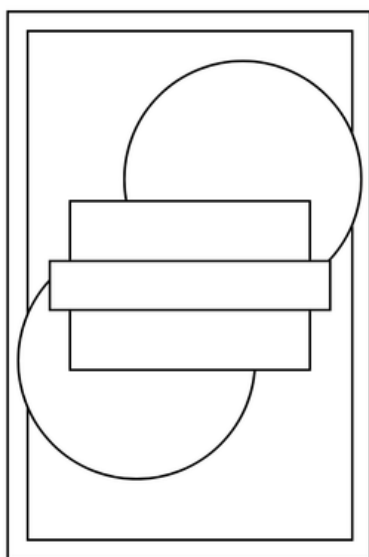

### Supplies

- Nature's Symphony Photopolymer Stamp Set
- Nature's Symphony Die Set
- Paradise Garden Photopolymer Stamp Set
- Paradise Garden Die Set
- Nature's Walk Designer Series Paper
- Pecan Pie Card Stock
- Vanilla Card Stock
- Pecan Pie Stampin' Pad
- Early Espresso & Olive Linen Thread Pack
- Multipurpose Liquid Glue
- Dimensionals
- Stampin' Spritzer
- Paper Trimmer
- Cut and Emboss Machine

## Directions

- Cut a right side opening card base 21cm x 14.85 ( 8-1/2" x 5-1/2") from the Pecan Pie card stock. Score at 10.5cm (4-1/4"). Fold and burnish well.
- Optionally, but recommended, cut a card liner from vanilla card stock measuring 10cm x 14.35cm (4" x 5-1/4"). Adhere to the inside of the card.
- For the background, cut a rectangle from a piece of the Nature's Walk Designer Series Paper measuring 10cm x 14.35cm (4" x 5-1/4"). Adhere the background to the center of your card front leaving an equal border of card stock showing on all sides.
- Ink up the large leaf image from the Nature's Symphony Photopolymer Stamp Set using the Pecan Pie ink. Before stamping on to the vanilla card stock, lightly spritz the inked stamp with water. Gently press the stamp onto your card stock. The image will be very textured and 'water-color-y'. Repeat this stamping method on another piece of the vanilla card stock. I also spattered some of the Pecan Pie ink onto the images by tapping a watercolor brush (loaded with the ink) over the images to create darker dots. Cut the images out with the matching die from the Nature's Symphony Die Set. Glue the textured leaf images flat to the card front using the finished photo as a guide.
- Next, die cut the 'wood grain' rectangle from the Nature's Symphony Die set out of Pecan Pie card stock.
- Stamp the greeting, I used the one from the Paradise Garden Photopolymer stamp set, onto a scrap of vanilla card stock. Die cut out the greeting using the long narrow die from the Paradise Garden Die Set.
- Adhere the greeting piece over the die cut 'wood grain' piece. Cut a length of Early Espresso linen thread and loop it several times around three fingers. Tape this looped thread piece to the back of the 'wood grain' piece. See finished photo.
- Place dimensionals on the back of the greeting unit and adhere to the center of the card.
