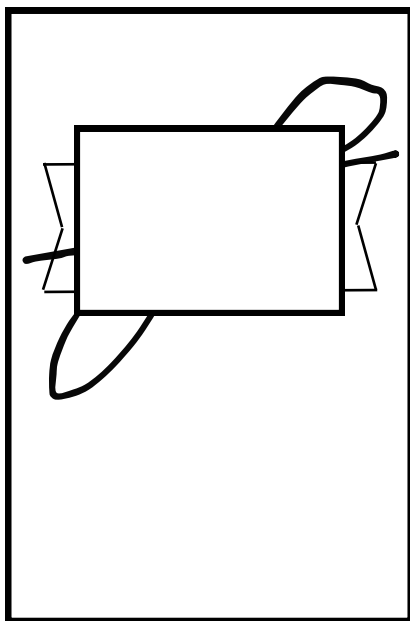

Supplies

- Frames and Phrases Photopolymer Stamp Set
- Stylish Shapes Dies
- Country Woods Designer Series Paper
- Early Espresso Card Stock
- Basic Beige Card Stock
- Crumb Cake Card Stock
- Early Espresso Stampin' Pad
- Linen Thread
- Multipurpose Liquid Glue
- Stampin' Dimensionals
- Paper Trimmer
- Cut and Emboss Machine

Directions

- Cut a bottom opening card base 21cm x 14.85 (8-1/2" x 5-1/2") from the Early Espresso card stock. Score at 10.5cm (4-1/4"). Fold and burnish well.
- Cut a card liner from Basic Beige card stock measuring 10cm x 14.35cm (4" x 5-1/4"). Adhere to the inside of the card.
- Cut a piece of the Country Woods Designer Series Paper to 10cm x 14.35cm (4" x 5-1/4"). Adhere this piece flat to the card front leaving an equal border of the dark brown showing all the way around.
- Die cut the the the 6.5cm x 6.5 (2-1/2" x 2-1/2") square from the Stylish Shapes die set out of a coordinating scrap of Country Woods Designer Series Paper. Using this this square now center the next smaller size square die, 5.6cm x .6cm (2" x 2") and cut out the center of the square leaving a frame. (Use the center square on another project)
- Die cut the large flag shape from the Stylish Shapes die set out of a scrap of Crumb Cake card stock. Stamp the greeting using Early Espresso ink. Note: if you may need to stamp the greeting slightly off center toward the right side of the flag. I had to with this greeting but I made a similar card and used a shorter greeting and did not need to offset it.
- Cut a length of linen thread and tie a large loose bow.
- To assemble the greeting piece place mini dimensionals on the four corner and one each in the center of the top and bottom of the frame. Thread the flag strip through the back of one side of the frame and over the the top of the right side of the frame. I used a small amount of glue to stick the flag strip to the front of the frame. The bow was placed on the back side of the flag strip with a small piece of cello tape. I threaded the loops and tails through the frame so they would rest on top. Place the onto the card front with the dimensionals. See the finished photo for placement.
