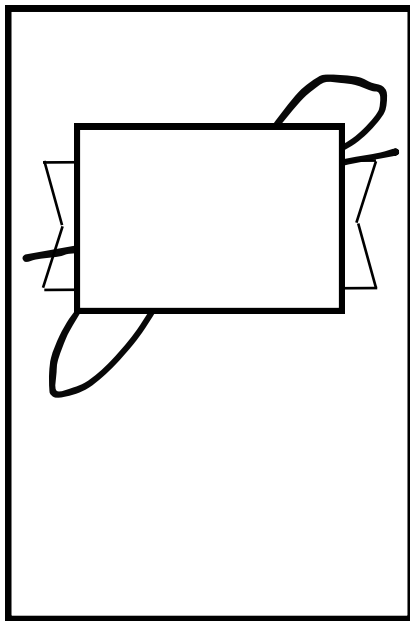

Supplies

- Paradise Garden Photopolymer Stamp Set
- Paradise Garden Dies
- Perennial Postage Dies
- Garden Poetry Designer Series Paper
- Blackberry Bliss Card Stock
- Basic White Card Stock
- Blackberry Bliss Stampin' Pad
- Berry Burst Shiney Ribbon
- Multipurpose Liquid Glue
- Stampin' Dimensionals
- Paper Trimmer
- Cut and Emboss Machine

Directions

- Cut a side opening card base 21cm x 14.85 (8-1/2" x 5-1/2") from the Blackberry Bliss card stock. Score at 10.5cm (4-1/4"). Fold and burnish well.
- Cut a card liner from Basic White card stock measuring 10cm x 14.35cm (4" x 5-1/4"). Adhere to the inside of the card.
- Cut a piece of the Garden Poetry Designer Series Paper to 10cm x 14.35cm (4" x 5-1/4"). Adhere this piece flat to the card front leaving an equal border of the black showing all the way around.
- Die cut a backing piece for the greeting out of a scrap of Blackberry Bliss card stock. I used the 7.4cm x 5.4cm (2-7/8" x 2-1/8") rectangle from the Perennial Postage die set but you could just cut a plain rectangle if you do not have an appropriate die.
- Stamp the greeting using Blackberry Bliss ink onto a scrap of the same piece of Designer Series Paper you used above. For this project I used the back of background pattern.
- Die cut the greeting out using the matching die from the Paradise Garden set.
- Adhere the greeting to the center of the Blackberry Bliss rectangle.
- Cut a length of the ribbon to approximately 38cm (15"). You can either tie it into a large loose bow or just loop the ribbon into shape. Adhere to the back side of the greeting piece. I used cello tape because it was easy and I did not want the back to be sticky.
- Place dimensionals on the back of the greeting piece. Be sure to include a dimensional at each end of the greeting strip to support it (as it is paper and not card stock).
- Adhere the greeting to the card front using the finished photo or the card sketch as a guide to placement.
